Jacob

- <u>Gen_25:27</u> And the boys grew: and Esau was a cunning hunter, a man of the field; and <u>Jacob</u> was a plain man, dwelling in tents.
- Gen 25:28 And Isaac loved Esau, because he did eat of his venison: but Rebekah loved Jacob.
- Gen 25:29 And Jacob sod pottage: and Esau came from the field, and he was faint:
- <u>Gen_25:30</u> And Esau said to <mark>Jacob</mark>, Feed me, I pray thee, with that same red *pottage*; for I *am* faint: therefore was his name called Edom.
- Gen 25:31 And Jacob said, Sell me this day thy birthright.
- <u>Gen_25:33</u> And <u>Jacob</u> said, Swear to me this day; and he sware unto him: and he sold his birthright unto <u>Jacob</u>.
- <u>Gen 25:34</u> Then Jacob gave Esau bread and pottage of lentiles; and he did eat and drink, and rose up, and went his way: thus Esau despised *his* birthright.
- <u>Gen 27:6</u> And Rebekah spake unto <mark>Jacob</mark> her son, saying, Behold, I heard thy father speak unto Esau thy brother, saying,
- Gen 27:11 And Jacob said to Rebekah his mother, Behold, Esau my brother is a hairy man, and I am a smooth man:
- Gen 27:15 And Rebekah took goodly raiment of her eldest son Esau, which were with her in the house, and put them upon Jacob her younger son:
- Gen 27:17 And she gave the savoury meat and the bread, which she had prepared, into the hand of her son Jacob.
- Gen 27:19 And Jacob said unto his father, I am Esau thy firstborn; I have done according as thou badest me: arise, I pray thee, sit and eat of my venison, that thy soul may bless me.
- <u>Gen 27:21</u> And Isaac said unto <mark>Jacob</mark>, Come near, I pray thee, that I may feel thee, my son, whether thou *be* my very son Esau or not.
- <u>Gen 27:22</u> And Jacob went near unto Isaac his father; and he felt him, and said, The voice is Jacob's voice, but the hands are the hands of Esau.
- <u>Gen 27:30</u> And it came to pass, as soon as Isaac had made an end of blessing Jacob, and Jacob was yet scarce gone out from the presence of Isaac his father, that Esau his brother came in from his hunting.
- <u>Gen 27:36</u> And he said, Is not he rightly named <u>Jacob</u>? for he hath supplanted me these two times: he took away my birthright; and, behold, now he hath taken away my blessing. And he said, Hast thou not reserved a blessing for me?
- <u>Gen 27:41</u> And Esau hated <u>Jacob</u> because of the blessing wherewith his father blessed him: and Esau said in his heart, The days of mourning for my father are at hand; then will I slay my brother <u>Jacob</u>.
- <u>Gen 27:42</u> And these words of Esau her elder son were told to Rebekah: and she sent and called Jacob her younger son, and said unto him, Behold, thy
- brother Esau, as touching thee, doth comfort himself, purposing to kill thee.
- Gen_27:46 And Rebekah said to Isaac, I am weary of my life because of the daughters of Heth: if Jacob take a wife of the daughters of Heth, such as these which are of the daughters of the land,

what good shall my life do me?

Gen 28:1 And Isaac called Jacob, and blessed him, and charged him, and said unto him, Thou shalt not take a wife of the daughters of Canaan.

<u>Gen 28:5</u> And Isaac sent away <u>Jacob</u>: and he went to Padanaram unto Laban, son of Bethuel the Syrian, the brother of Rebekah, <u>Jacob</u>'s and Esau's mother.

<u>Gen 28:6</u> When Esau saw that Isaac had blessed <u>Jacob</u>, and sent him away to Padanaram, to take him a wife from thence; and that as he blessed him he gave him a charge, saying, Thou shalt not take a wife of the daughters of Canaan;

Gen_28:7 And that Jacob obeyed his father and his mother, and was gone to Padanaram;

Gen_28:10 And Jacob went out from Beersheba, and went toward Haran.

Gen 28:16 And Jacob awaked out of his sleep, and he said, Surely the LORD is in this place; and I knew it not.

Gen 28:18 And Jacob rose up early in the morning, and took the stone that he had put *for* his pillows, and set it up *for* a pillar, and poured oil upon the top of it.

Gen 28:20 And Jacob vowed a vow, saying, If God will be with me, and will keep me in this way that I go, and will give me bread to eat, and raiment to put on,

Gen 29:1 Then Jacob went on his journey, and came into the land of the people of the east.
